






Marcia Conway

What Happened to the "Shag Tag Project?



When the Going Gets Tough ... We Get Tougher!

The shag clubs in Virginia will have to postpone getting the shag license plates for 2008 because a sub-committee of the House of Delegates Transportation Committee "carried over" our Bill until next year's 2009 General Assembly session.

A disappointment?" Of course. A fatal blow? NO! Here's what happened and here's how we'll make this system work!

In May 2007, the Richmond Shag Club, at the request of the other eight shag clubs in Virginia, was asked to be the Sponsor of a Bill to create a Virginia "shag tag." Seeing "shag tags" from North and South Carolina at S.O.S. gave us increased resolve to "get it done" in Virginia, but better.

As you know, this past summer a written survey was conducted in all Virginia shag clubs to determine whether we had sufficient members interested in purchasing these special license plates and to choose a striking design, one that shows others the fun that we have and also creates in the general public an interest to join us in our fun and philanthropic activities. (For the Richmond Shag Club, more than \$166,000 has been donated to Camp Fantastic, a summer camp for children with cancer, showing where our hearts are). The more members, the more people having fun and the more donations to these brave children.

We had enough interest in the summer and fall paper-and-pencil survey to easily meet the State Code requirements for the minimum number of purchases, so we took this project forward. We did our homework!

We created a license plate (thanks to Don Borja, Battlefield Boogie Club) that was strikingly attractive. The logo, a 4-color jukebox with the silhouette of a couple shag dancing in front of it and the words, "Shag Dance Clubs of Virginia" on the lower edge, appeals to many Virginia shaggers. I've even taken shag tag to parking lots and restaurants to ask people whether they liked it. They raved!

Preparing for the 2008 General Assembly we found a Patron, Delegate Manoli Loupassi (R-68), willing to carry our request forward. Mr. Loupassi, a practicing attorney and former President of the Richmond City Council, is a first-time Delegate representing part of the City of Richmond and part of Chesterfield County. He championed our Bill, HB1427.

Shortly before presentation to sub-committee # 3 of the House Transportation Committee, I heard from Mr. Loupassi's office that the office the chair of the sub-committee was requesting at least 350 signed applications before the sub-committee would hear it.

We were operating in the understanding that, according to State Code 46.2-725, B. 1, the applications were due to Virginia DMV "within 30 days of the effective date of the authorization," that being July 1. Therefore, according to law, all applications are due by the end of July 2008.

However, the chair, Delegate Ed Scott (R-30), allowed me to appear before his sub-committee, and I brought 77 signed applications, completed 7 days before the meeting, to demonstrate "good faith" that we were interested and could deliver. Nevertheless, the sub-committee voted to recommend continuing our Bill to be considered during the 2009 General Assembly session.

Mr. Scott explained to me that a large number of applicants for special license plates were approved in past years and failed to get the minimum number of subscribers before the end of July. This necessitated that the General Assembly pass another Bill rescinding their authorization. Mr. Scott wishes to avoid wasting the time and effort of elected officials to consider Bills in which sponsors inadequately research the commitment of their organizations and, therefore, do not deliver the minimum applications to DMV.

What distinguishes a "winner?" We've heard it before: "Getting up one more time than you're knocked down!" I believe that members of all nine shag clubs in Virginia are "winners!"

What we need to do. Doug Strother, RSC President in '06, and I will team up for the RSC to determine as specifically as possible how many RSC members want license plates. All Virginia clubs will do the same this spring. If we have interest to buy at least 350 "shag tags" from all clubs (the state's shag membership is 2000+) we'll proceed. I KNOW THAT WE DO! EASILY! The RSC has 22% of the state's shaggers, and this translates into a minimum target of 77 license plates from our club. This is very do-able!

In the fall and by the end of November we'll collect accurate, completed, signed motor vehicle registrations for the special license plates identified for each vehicle (a VIN is required), including owners' personal checks to pay the fees.

In preparation for this activity, all forms and instructions will be on the RSC website, and we'll mail to those RSC members who do not have a computer. Doug and I will be available to answer any individual questions. Each Virginia shag club will have their respective coordinator to do what we're doing, so this will work!

The Richmond Shag Club will collect applications and checks from all clubs.

In January 2009 we'll take these applications to the House of Delegates Transportation Committee and show them, one-by-one if necessary, who "walks the walk" among our state's shag club members and has committed to own a *first edition "shag tag."* Delegate Loupassi told me that at the 2009 session. "We'll get them!" He used to be a prosecutor, and he is bright, committed, very cordial, and intense. When he says it will happen, it WILL happen! He's batting for us, and we are extremely fortunate!

After the Bill passes both the House and Senate and is signed into law by the Governor, we can collect more applications before submitting them to DMV in mid-Spring.

DMV works with the 3M Corporation in Minneapolis to develop a metal prototype based upon our proposed design. When completed and DMV shows us, we approve it and our plate goes into production. By the way, I spoke with 3M this summer after sending them a *jpeg* copy of our plate. Their response was "interesting and attractive – one of the nicest Virginia has produced!"

The plates, produced by the Virginia Department of Prison Industries, will be mailed directly to individuals during the following January to March 2010.

This plan will work depending upon whether each if you has a strong commitment to make it work.

(1) Will you identify the vehicle (or more) in the fall for the plate and wait to get it 15 months later? Our plate costs \$10 a year extra each year. (2) Will you let the state choose your "tag" letters and numbers or do you want a special 6-letter/number combo vanity plate of your own choice? (Remember, our logo takes 1 of the 7 spaces, leaving 6 spaces available for you). That's also \$10 a year additional. The DMV website tells what is available now. (Suggestion: Buy your 6-space personalized tag on a standard plate now, reserving it for when the "shag tag" becomes available and can be transferred. We did).

Ultimately, the "will" is yours, <u>each member's</u>. Personally, I've got a *burn* to go around town and to S.O.S. and other shag events with that special plate! Don't you?

Consider being one of the more than 350 proud shaggers displaying Virginia's unique and colorful *First Edition* "Shag Tag!"
